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Trezevant To Revive Industrial Board

TREZEVANT(January 13) — The Trezevant Board of Mayor and Aldermen confronted significant development and procedural hurdles at its January 13 meeting, with the long-dormant Industrial Development Board (IDB) at the center of the debate. The meeting concluded with a call to formally reconstitute the seven-member IDB to address key property issues, most notably the transfer and potential rezoning of the former Hillsman property located adjacent to Pat's Restaurant on Highway 79.

The IDB has been “dormant” in recent years, with all member terms expired, but its role remains critical. City Attorney Charlie Trotter stressed the need to elect seven new members to bring the board into compliance and proceed with development. Alderman Don Barger, who has successfully recruited seven proposed new members, suggested presenting a slate of seven nominees to the Council for approval, as required by state law. Previously, the Industrial Board inappropriately appointed

The Carroll County Civic Center has new digital signage facing drivers on East Main Street, and more renovations are underway thanks to two individual grants awarded to the county event space. Upcoming renovations include additional building improvements, a community board room installation and a kitchen expansion.

Civic Center Director Natalie McMasters shared that

Updated List Of Candidates

CARROLL COUNTY (January 15) — Political races for county offices, school board seats and some municipal seats are officially underway, with 56 individuals holding petitions for local offices on the May and August 2026 ballots.

The primary election for county offices and board of education seats — for each political party — is Tuesday, May 5, 2026.

All candidates, party affiliated or independent, must file their petitions by noon on February 19, 2026, to be

considered for the May 5 primary and August general election.

Following the primary election is the Thursday, August 6, general election — which includes the county office race, board of education race and Clarksburg municipal race for mayor and two alderman seats. Also August 6 is the primary election for state governor, state representative, U.S. Senate and U.S. Congress seats.

Candidates must qualify by March 10 at noon to be put on the August 6 election ballot.

Carroll County Election Deputy Administrator Jennifer Hilliard provided the following list of petitioners and qualified candidates on January 15 at 8 a.m.

Currently, 20 individuals seek Republican (R) nominations, one individual seeks office as a Democrat (D) candidate and 37 individuals seek office as independent (I) candidates. Twelve have filed their petitions and have officially qualified for candidacy.

Circuit Court Clerk (four-year term): Incumbent Sarah Bradberry (R) is the sole petitioner-holder.

County Mayor (four-year term): Incumbent Joseph Butler (R) is the sole petitioner-holder.

Property Assessor (four-year term): Incumbent Rita Jones is not seeking re-election. John Austin (R) is the sole petitioner-holder and has filed, solidifying his candidacy.

County Clerk (four-year term): Incumbent Darlene Kirk (I) is the sole petitioner-holder and has filed, solidifying her candidacy.

Trustee (four-year term): Incumbent Paula Bolen (I) is the sole petitioner-holder and has filed, solidifying her candidacy.

Register of Deeds (four-year term): Incumbent Natalie Porter (D) and Chad Barnhart (R) have each picked up petitions for this office. Porter filed her petition January 12, qualifying for candidacy.

County Sheriff (four-year term): Incumbent Sheriff Andy Dickson is not seeking re-election. Joel Pate (R), Tim Pratt (R), Eric Sawyers (R), Michael A. Smith (I) and Ryan White (I) have each picked up petitions for this office. Pratt, Sawyers and White have filed their petitions, qualifying for the county sheriff race.

Road Supervisor (four-year term): The county has reduced the number of road supervisors from two to one effective September 1, 2026. Incumbent Ronnie Wade (I) and newcomers Otis Nesbitt (I) and William Jason Longmire (I) have picked petitions for the position. Wade and Longmire have completed and filed their petitions, qualifying for candidacy.

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for the Republican State Executive Committee Man and Woman seats, held by Ryan Ellegood and Tess Robbins, respectively.

The following county commission seats have four-year terms:

There are three District

1 (Atwood, Cedar Grove, Lavinia) seats on the ballot. Incumbents Darrell Ridgely (R), Jimmy Halford (I) and Randy Long (I) have each picked up petitions.

There are two District 2 (McLemoresville, Trezevant) seats on the ballot, held by Daniel Willman and Lana Y. Suite. Incumbent Lana Y. Suite (I) has picked up a petition for one seat.

There are two District 3 (Bruceton, Buena Vista, Sp. Grove, Vale) seats on the ballot — one vacant and one held by Joey Simmons. Newcomers Will McMackin (I), Amon Miller (I), Dwayne Tordsen (I) and Brandy Boyd (R) have each picked up petitions for these seats.

There are two District 4 (Cannon, Hollow Rock, Macedonia) seats on the ballot. Incumbents Morris Rogers (R) and Daniel J. Thomas (R) have each picked up petitions.

There are three District 5 (Civic Center) seats on the ballot, held by Joey Darnall, Cyril Ostiguy and Barry Mac Murphy. Incumbents Cyril Ostiguy (R) and Barry Mac Murphy (I) and newcomers Paul D. Hugueley (I), Rakaya Humphreys (I), Anna Wheat (I), Curt Taylor (I) and Jimmy Crossett (R) have each picked up petitions for these seats. Murphy is the sole petitioner-holder to file.

There are two District 6 (Clarksburg, Concord, New Liberty, Westport) seats on the ballot. Incumbents Jimmy D. McClure (I) and Philip E. Moore (I) and newcomers Kurt Hunley (I) and Madison Boyd Endres (R) are all petitioner-holders.

There are three District 7 (Huntingdon Police Station) seats on the ballot. Incumbents Walter Smothers (I) and Lori Dillahunt (R) and newcomer Lynn Grice (I) are petitioner-holders.

There are two District 8 (McKenzie Senior Citizens Center) seats on the ballot. Incumbents Jay Phipps (R) and Willie Huffman (I) each hold petitions.

There are three District 9 (McKenzie Church of Christ, City Hall) seats on the ballot, held by Jason R. Martin, Spiron L. Roditis and John Austin. Incumbents Jason R. Martin (I) and Spiron L. Roditis (I) and newcomer Rickey Price (I) each hold petitions. Martin and Price have filed their petitions, qualifying for the election.

There are three seats (four-year terms) available on the Carroll County School Board:

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for the District 1 (Lavinia, Cedar Grove, Atwood, McLemoresville, Trezevant, McKenzie Senior Citizens Center) seat, held by Mike Foster.

Incumbent Deborah Broadbent (I) is the sole petitioner-holder for the District 2 (Bruceton, Recycling Center, Hollow Rock, McKenzie Church of Christ, McKenzie City Hall) seat.

Incumbent Charlotte Tucker (I) is the sole petitioner-holder for the District 3 (Civic Center, Clarksburg, Concord/Westport, Huntingdon Police Station) seat.

There are four seats available on the Hollow

Rock-Bruceton Special School District school board:

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for the District 16 Hollow Rock city seat (2-year unexpired), held by Jonathan Tedford.

Incumbent Brandy Boyd (R) is the sole petitioner-holder for the District 16 Bruceton city seat (four-year term).

Incumbent April Hampton (I) and Eric Daniel Gonzalez (R) have picked up petitions for the District 16 at-large seat (four-year term).

Incumbent Michael Graves (I) is the sole petitioner-holder for the District 15 Buena Vista seat (four-year term).

There are two at-large seats available on the Huntingdon Special School District School Board (six-year term):

Incumbents Morgan Butler (I) and Shawna Smith (I) each hold petitions for the two at-large seats.

There are four at-large seats available on the McKenzie Special School District School Board (four-year term):

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for the McKenzie school board seats. Incumbents are Bobby Young, LaShonda Williams, Spiron L. Roditis and George Cassidy. Candidates must live in Carroll County.

There are two at-large seats on the ballot for the South Carroll Special School District School Board (four-year term):

Newcomer Sam Melton (I) is the sole petitioner-holder for one of the at-large seats. Incumbents are Christy Blount and Tom R. Miller.

There are three seats on the ballot to join the West Carroll Special School District School Board (four-year term):

Newcomers Patrick E. Lindsey (R) and Linda Black (I) hold petitions for the Old County seat, held by Betty Wallace.

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for the Old Atwood seat, held by Keith Murray.

Newcomer Paul Mueller (I) is the sole petitioner-holder for the Old Trezevant seat, held by Kelly M. Weaver.

The City of Clarksburg will hold an election for mayor and two alderman positions on August 6:

Currently, there are no petitioner-holders for Clarksburg mayor. Howell Todd is the current mayor.

Incumbent Barbara A. McClure has picked up a petition for one of two alderman positions. She is the sole petitioner holder. Judy Grant Smith currently holds the other alderman seat but has not yet picked up a petition for the seat.

Other offices on the August 6 primary midterm election ballot are David Kustoff's U.S. Congressional District 8 seat, Bill Haggerty's U.S. Senate seat, Bill Lee's Tennessee Governor seat, Tandy Darby's Tennessee House of Representatives District 76 seat and Brock Martin's Tennessee House of Representatives District 79 seat.

Brock Martin (R) has picked up a petition to maintain his House of Representatives District 79 seat.

and Lana Suite to the Carroll County Industrial Development Board; Resolution 1-02-2026 appointing Wesley Bradley to the Carroll County Board of Zoning Appeals and Carroll County Regional Planning Commission; Resolution 1-03-2026 appointing Morris Rogers and Michael Williamson to the Carroll County Agricultural Extension Board.

Lastly, there was a presentation from the Carroll County FFA group on agricultural issues, a Carroll County Prevention Coalition update by Heather Foster, and approval of the Committees of the Carroll County Legislative Body.

the event space received a \$2 million connectivities grant in December 2024, which fully funded the repainting and re-flooring inside the Civic Center as well as the building's repaved parking lot. Most of the renovations from this grant occurred during summer 2025, including intense maintenance of the main building's restrooms.

The digital signage facing East Main Street drivers is the Civic Center's most recent installation paid by the connectivities grant. It signifies the turn onto Mustang Drive to help drivers find the Carroll County Civic Center and the Carroll County Inclusion Park. The digital screen presents a slideshow of the Civic Center's upcoming events.

The connectivities grant ends October 2026, and McMasters said there are still some renovations in store for the area.

For one, there are plans in place to build a new awning at the front of the building. McMasters also shared that the Civic Center will have a designated community board room. The room, empty at the moment aside from a table, will have a smart board, a conference table and chairs to seat 10-15 people.

"You could have training or you could have a business meeting," said McMasters. "Hopefully that room will be used mostly during the week

... It's going to be its own little space where, maybe, people who typically work out of their homes can conduct a business meeting."

The exhibit building behind the Civic Center also faces a renovation in the near future. The renovation includes replacing the building's overhead halogen lights with recessed lighting, replacing the flooring and improving the restrooms.

The restrooms in the back of the Civic Center, which have historically been used during the county fair but have been out of order for several years, will also be renovated before October.

The Civic Center also received a \$100,000 grant from the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, which McMasters said will be used to renovate the kitchen space inside the main building. After renovations, the kitchen

will be double its current size, said McMasters, as it is expanding into part of the Civic Center's main room. It will have two stoves, two refrigerators and more preparation space.

McMasters hopes for the Civic Center's space to become a commissary kitchen for local entrepreneurs and caterers. It would be the only commissary kitchen to exist in rural West Tennessee.

"There are a lot of caterers who cater out of their home," said McMasters "If they had a catering order for 200 [people] or something, we're hoping they could come here [to the Civic Center] and use our kitchen instead of destroying their homes."

Kitchen renovations have not yet started, but McMasters anticipates they will begin in late February or early March, with an April end date.

its own members.

Property Proposals Fuel Debate

The future of key properties dominated the discussion:

- The vacant Hillsman Property: A citizen, speaking on behalf of Mr. Phil Colwell, proposed purchasing city land next to Pat's Restaurant—a property officially owned by the IDB—to build a family-owned discount store.

- The citizen was quickly redirected, as the property is currently zoned R1 (Residential). Both the City Attorney and former IDB member, Barger clarified that any proposal must first go through the Planning Commission for the proposed rezoning. The newly formed IDB, however, first action upon receiving the property from the city must be to seek rezoning from residential to B1 (Commercial).

- Survey Commissioned: The board approved a motion to immediately hire a surveyor to conduct a survey for the vacant Hillsman property, deemed a "necessary and immediate step" for the possible sale to Colwell.

- Historic Church Acquisition: The board considered a proposal from Rita Foster, a citizen, for the town to acquire the historic Trezevant Cumberland Presbyterian Church for community use, including a venue for cho- ruses, town hall meetings, and small weddings. Citing the building's zoning restrictions that make an auction difficult, the proposal sug-

gested that the church could be acquired as a gift or for a nominal fee from the defunct congregation. The church closed in 2024. Concerns were raised about the building's condition, which one speaker suggested might be a "\$100,000 liability." The board voted for Attorney Charlie Trotter to contact the owners' legal representation in Dyersburg to investigate the building's condition, sale interest, and potential liabilities before proceeding.

Vetting Process and Financial Risks

The discussion underscored the IDB's significant financial power, which includes the authority to pledge the town's full faith and credit for its debts, a practice that has historically led to taxpayer liability in other towns. This sparked a discussion about vetting new members. While the statute requires members to be town electors, some board members advocated for a formal, public vetting process that could include credit and background checks to ensure the newly empowered board acts responsibly. It was

noted that the new board must be educated on open meeting laws, as the previous board's bylaws incorrectly stated that no public notice was required for meetings.

In Other Board News:

• Fire Engine Relocation:

The city fire engine was relocated to a single fire station in October to satisfy an insurance-mandated ISO rating assessment. The move has improved response times by allowing staff and gear to depart from a single location, and the city engine has since been used successfully at a house fire. The department continues to face staffing shortages, with four new recruits in training expected to be ready in about six months. Councilman Leon Lyell said the department has mutual aid agreements with the County Of Carroll's fire department and receives assistance most notably from McLemoresville, Atwood and McKenzie departments.

- **Police Staffing:** The police department is now fully staffed with the return of Mr. Mike Mulligan, who returns to the department as a full-time officer, working alternating shifts to maintain an unpredictable presence.

- **Permit Protocol:** A detailed proposal was presented to establish a formal building permit protocol to improve efficiency and ensure legal compliance with ordinances. Councilman Dan Dieringer presented a plan that includes a structured workflow for applications, reviews, and appeals. Action was taken to schedule a meeting with a Municipal Technical Advisory Service (MTAS) attorney to advise on establishing fees, fines, and updating local code books.

We're just so grateful for Webb Alumni and what they do for the community. Just a great day to honor Martin Luther King and remember that love is truly the ultimate gift to serve to one another."

Carroll County Sheriff’s Reports

Property Transfers

Assault Investigation — On January 9, Deputy Paul Williams responded to a report of an assault involving neighbors in the Willow Run Road area in Huntingdon.

According to the report, the complainant stated the incident began after a worker from a nearby property drove a truck through the complainant's yard to avoid a pothole in the road. The complainant reported going to the neighboring property to ask that vehicles not drive through the yard, and said the neighbor became upset, threatened him, and later came to the complainant's residence.

The complainant stated the neighbor exited his vehicle, began yelling, and punched him in the face. The complainant reported he restrained the neighbor until he calmed down and then released him. The complainant further stated the neighbor later swung a cane at him before leaving the area.

Deputy Williams then made contact with the neighbor, who provided a different account. The neighbor stated he heard yelling and came outside to find the complainant speaking to the worker in a vulgar and disrespectful manner.

The neighbor reported the complainant made threats toward him and the worker and refused to leave when told to get off the property. The neighbor stated the complainant continued yelling vulgar remarks, including a racial slur.

The neighbor also reported that when he

later went to the complainant's residence, the complainant came outside with a pistol and threatened him before placing the gun down and continuing the confrontation in the roadway. The neighbor stated he pushed the complainant back during the argument and struck him once during the altercation.

Written statements were obtained from multiple parties. One witness reported he attempted to avoid the pothole and did not intentionally drive into the yard and said he apologized, but the complainant remained angry and made threats. Another individual stated she did not see the physical altercation but heard the argument and took cover inside the home with a child after being told the neighbor was coming to shoot the house.

Deputy Williams advised the complainant that due to the conflicting accounts, the case would be forwarded to the district attorney's office for review regarding possible charges.

Later the same day, deputies were called back to the area regarding another complaint of a vehicle driving through the yard. Deputy Williams noted the area appeared consistent with a vehicle straddling a mud hole, and no property damage was observed. Neither party had survey paperwork available, and both were advised to seek civil legal guidance to establish property lines and resolve the ongoing dispute.

Drug Charges — On January 11, Deputy Dustin McClure conducted a traffic stop in Carroll County after observing a vehicle abruptly slow and display an equipment violation involving the license plate light.

During the stop, Deputy McClure made contact with the occupants and observed that the front-seat passenger, Phillip Dale Stanford, 58, of Atwood, was not wearing a seatbelt. While speaking with the occupants, the deputy noted nervous behavior that was inconsistent with a routine traffic stop. The occupants were separated, and a K-9 unit was requested to conduct an open-air sniff of the vehicle.

The K-9 alerted to the presence of narcotics on the passenger side of the vehicle and in the area where Stanford had been seated. Deputies subsequently located multiple small plastic bags containing a crystal-like substance that field-tested positive for methamphetamine, along with a glass pipe containing residue. Review of in-car camera footage showed Stanford discarding the items prior to their discovery.

Based on the investigation, Stanford was arrested and transported to the Carroll County Jail on charges related to possession of methamphetamine with intent and possession of drug paraphernalia. The incident occurred in Carroll County.

All Other Offenses — On Jan. 12, Deputy Jayden Flaurr respond-

ed to an ankle monitor proximity alert in the Clay Farm Road area involving Tommy Joe Kail Jr., 41, of Atwood.

Prior to deputies' arrival, a red Chevrolet Silverado matching the suspect vehicle was observed leaving the residence. Deputy Flaurr confirmed the vehicle description and began following it, observing the driver fail to maintain his lane of travel multiple times.

Deputy Flaurr activated emergency lights and sirens; however, the vehicle continued traveling down Clay Farm Road while weaving and failing to maintain its lane. The vehicle eventually pulled into a residence on Clay Farm Road, where Kail was taken into custody without further incident.

During an inventory search of the vehicle, deputies located two prescription pill bottles inside the glove box. One bottle contained two baggies with a white crystalline substance, while the other contained approximately 75 blue pills later identified as Alprazolam, along with a used methamphetamine pipe. Additional suspected methamphetamine was also recovered.

Kail was arrested and charged with felony evading arrest, possession of Schedule II with intent, possession of drug paraphernalia, and violation of a court order.

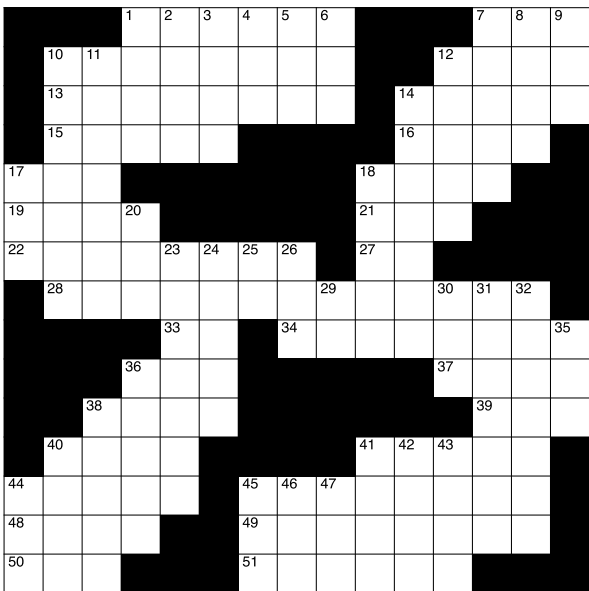

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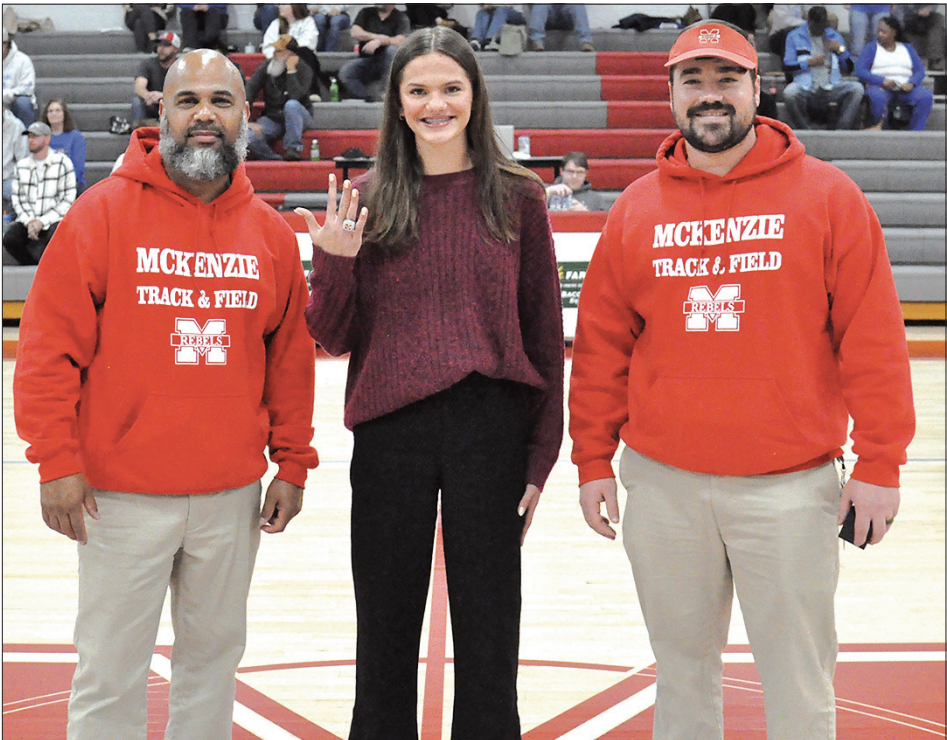
